Amos is from Mopia village within Kajiado county (close to Nairobi county). He is married with five children, ranging from high school to toddler age. He used to help at Mopia Lutheran church as well as run a book shop and was an mpesa (mobile money) agent before he became site manager in February 2017. His favorite thing about his job is that he is taking care of children who entirely depend on him. He is honored by the fact that they share their hearts - good and bad- with him as he is their immediate guardian. The most difficult part of his job is not being able to assist everyone in the community. He is often asked for assistance and yet is limited.

Amos leaves us with his favorite Bible verse, coming from the book of Hosea chapter 14 verse 3: "In you the orphan finds mercy".
